

By M. T. Anderson


A boy never questions his charmed life in revolutionary Boston until he opens a forbidden door and discovers hideous experiments – and his own chilling role in them.

By Lynda Durrant


Dressed as a boy, Jennie Rodgers managed to serve for three years as a soldier in the civil war without being discovered. This is her true and unbelievable story.

By Mal Peet


When Tamar's grandfather dies, she inherits a box full of clues that convey the story of another Tamar – one who lived through the horror of World War II.

By Richard Peck



By Meg Rosoff


After her aunt goes away on business, fifteen-year-old Daisy and her cousins are forced to survive on their own as England is bombed by an unnamed enemy.

By Marcus Sedgwick


At the outbreak of World War I, Shasha realizes she can see when someone's going to die. But when her visions show her brother Thomas, she'll risk everything to save him.
