




Prom Nights From Hell

In this collection of stories, teen authors from Meg Cabot to Stephanie Meyer write about nights that take bad proms to a whole new level – a paranormally bad level.


Prom Queen Geeks


A Really Nice Prom Mess

Dateless and heart-broken Jack Grammar's two best friends set up an online ad contest to take him to the prom. The only problem? He's got one week to chose between 24 girls...


Top Ten Uses of an Unworn Prom Dress


Prom Crashers
