




By Alice Kuipers


Told entirely in a series of notes left on the kitchen fridge, this is the story of nine months in the life of 15-year-old Claire and her single mother.

By Judy Bloom


Katherine and Michael can't get enough of each other, but it's senior year of high school, and there are big changes ahead.

By Cecil Castellucci


What happens when an antisocial cinophile meets up with the worldly new guy at school — a quick-witted artist who's savvy enough to see through her sci-fi disguise?

By Rachel Vail



By E. Lockhart


