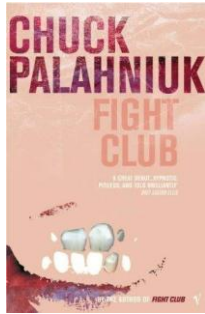

By Kentaro Miura

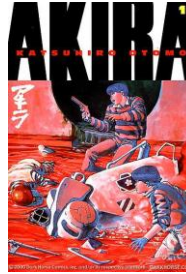
Berserk centers on a mercenary warrior and as he ages he realizes the value of camaraderie.

By Larry Doyle

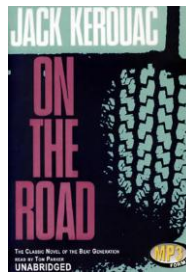
On graduation day, Denis stands in front of his 512 classmates and their 3000 relatives and announces: "I love you, Beth Cooper." Complications ensue.

By Katsuhiro Otomo

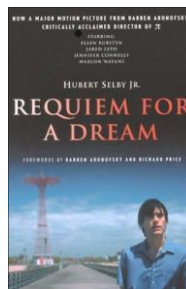
