
To Remy, love is predictable. That is, until she meets Dexter a messy, annoying musician who's all wrong... and maybe just right.


This is the story of Sophie and what happens when she falls head-over-heels for the biggest loser in school.


Just as she decides to give up on her longtime crush, he decides there may be more to her than meets the eye. Will these two love struck neighbors EVER get together?


Spirited Ella is under a spell – she must obey any command given to her. Finishing school escapes, a terrible step-family, and true love are only some of the challenges ahead.
